The Florida Perinatal Quality Collaborative (FPQC) works with statewide partners, hospitals, and providers to improve the health and health care quality of Florida's mothers and baby. FPQC is currently working with 33 Florida maternity hospitals to implement MORE-- Maternal Opioid Recovery Effort. Since fall of 2019, this quality improvement initiative has been working with hospitals, providers, and community partners to improve the health care and community services supporting mothers exposed to opioids during pregnancy including focuses on screening, prevention, treatment, referral, and policy. This presentation will describe mothers and current practices and will share the multifocal strategies being used through the initiatives and by partners.

This presentation will cover some of the myths and misconceptions surrounding harm reduction strategies utilizing evidence from the peer-reviewed literature as well as my experiences and the outcomes from directing a large-scale Narcan distribution program over the past 2+ years (including amidst a pandemic and a sharp rise in overdose hospitalizations and deaths). I will also discuss my community's successes and challenges in bringing together a diverse group of stakeholders over the past 10 months to move Duval County from "exploration" to "preparation" in implementing a Safe Syringe Program under the IDEA Act.
